#### FROM THE PRINCIPAL

Hi All.

This week saw Metung PS host a principals' conference. There were plenty of visitors wandering around the school examining what we do. Our students spoke well about their learning and I received excellent feedback about how calm, engaged and positive the school is. ...... I did already know that, but it is nice to hear it from visitors.

The junior room continue to work on the Roald Dahl book, Charlie and the Chocolate Factory. I was in the junior room working with some of the Year 1 students and they were writing stories about Charlie. It is so cool to be part of their learning.

The senior room has been continuing to read Superfudge. There has been some great class discussion about the characters and the figurative language used. In maths we have been doing percentages, division, multiplication and some algebra. The students have been very engaged and have been working hard trying to learn some new skills. Well done to all.

Currently the department has a focus on improving attendance. Here are some fairly telling statistics about how being away can have a serious impact on your child's learning.

If your child is beginning to show school refusal behaviours, please come and see your child's teacher and/or me and we will do our best to provide strategies to aid in getting your child to school. Sometimes just coming in for a yarn can be extremely valuable. With nearly 100 years of teaching experience between Mrs. Anketell, Mrs. Bennet and me, we have a lot of experience in this area. No judgement, just support. It is not always easy raising children. We are here to help if you should choose to seek it.

#### JUNIOR GRADES—MRS. BENNETT




Students in the junior grades made 'marshmallow towers' yesterday.


